

Research for Protocol Policy Systems

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1. Research Brief

Protocol Policy Systems (PPS) asked Socitm to assist them in obtaining qualitative feedback from ~ 30 UK councils on the development, adoption and deployment of IT policies.

The research information will be offered to respondents after the exercise is concluded should they wish to obtain a copy of the report.

2. Research Method

The research was undertaken using a mix of online, telephone and paper questionnaires.

Initially the Socitm membership was split down the middle with one half of the membership receiving an invitation to complete an online questionnaire whilst the others were invited to take part in a telephone interview.

Neither the online questionnaire or the invitations to interview yielded enough contacts. By way of a different approach, a paper questionnaire was distributed at a number of Socitm regional workshops and the Socitm Conference. The results of the paper questionnaire were then fed into the online questionnaire.

The research concluded with a total of 26 responses to the questionnaire and 2 telephone interviews. The findings are presented as follows:

3. Findings

Average number of policies in place among surveyed organisations

● 28.5%

Of surveyed organisations have <10 policies in place

● 7%

Of surveyed organisations have 10-20 policies in place

● 43%

Of surveyed organisations have 20+ policies in place

● 21.5%

Don't know the number policies in place in their organisation.

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For those with 20+ policies – 83% had policies covering users, managers & technical staff

For those with 10-20 policies – 50% had policies covering users, managers & technical staff

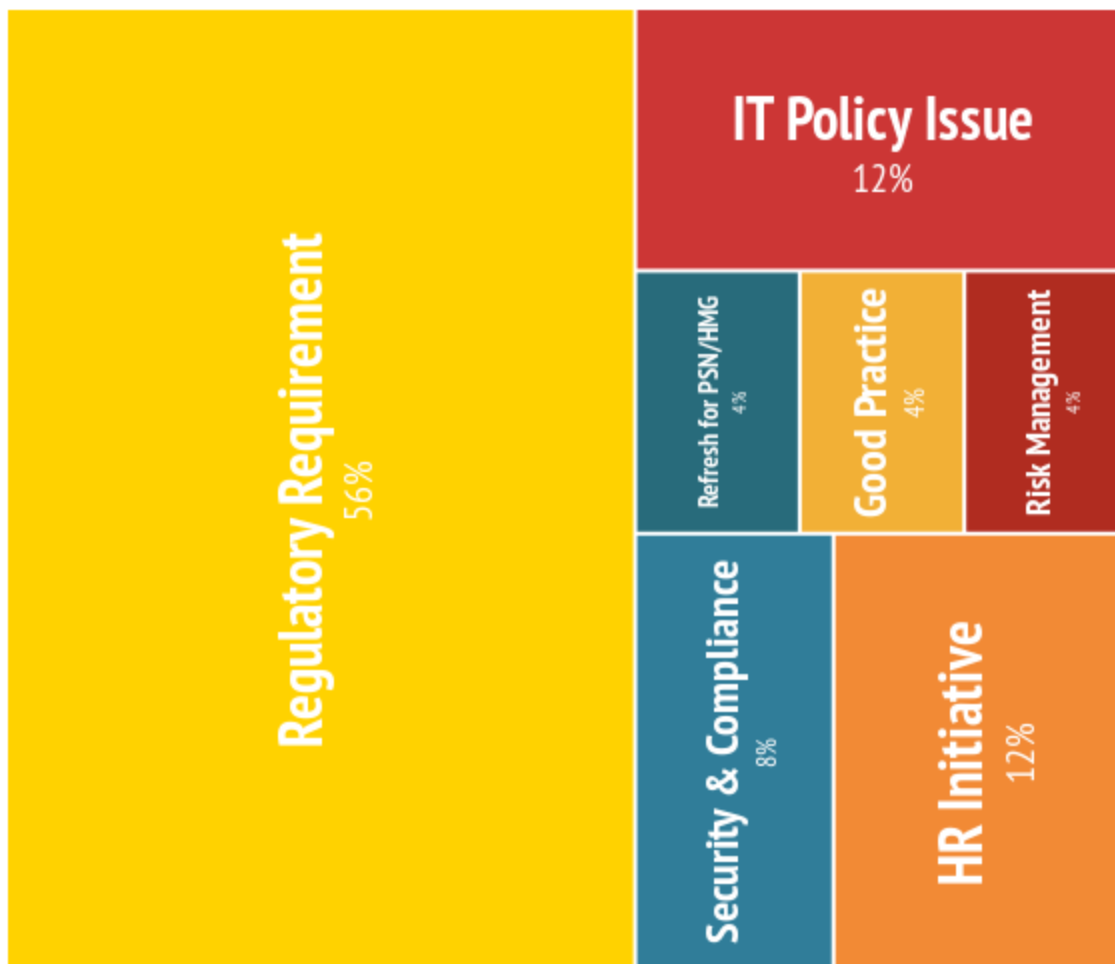

See IT Policy development as essential

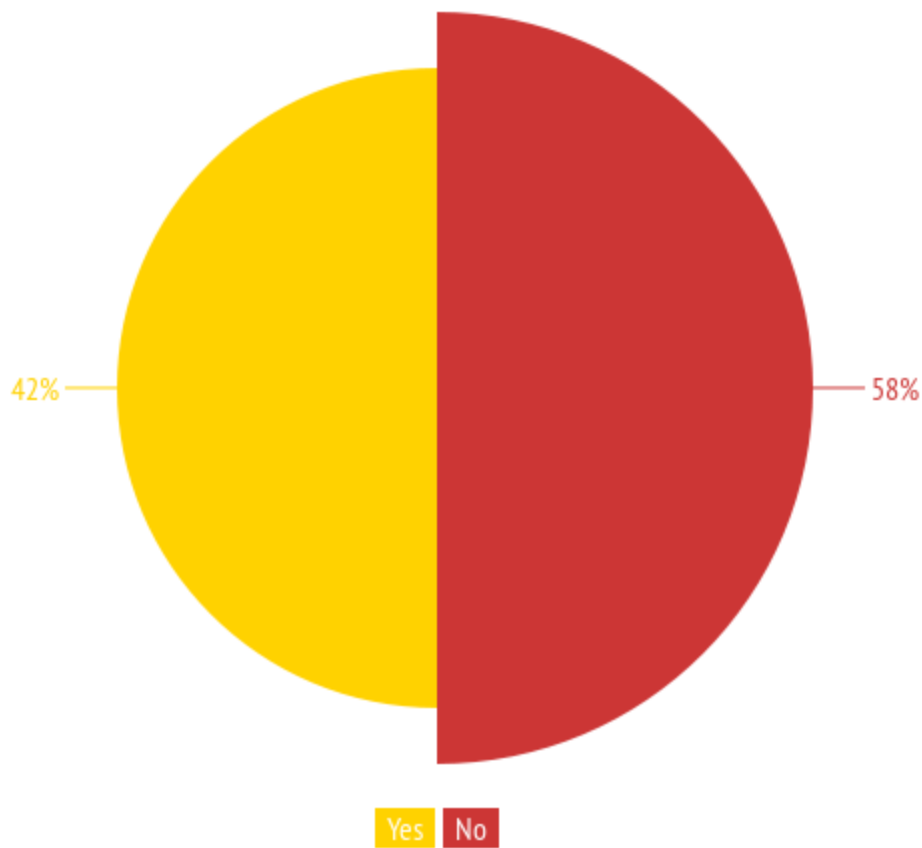


See IT Policy development as expensive
